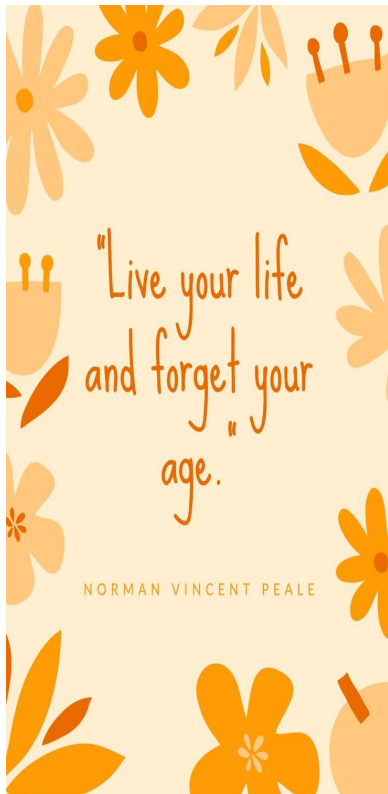

**Senior Advocacy & Notary Services:** Our advocate helps connect older adults with resources and services, and is also a certified notary.

## Prepare for Medicare Open Enrollment

You might be wondering, “Can I change my Medicare plan at any time?” or “When is the right time to make changes?” Medicare’s Open Enrollment Period, runs from October 15–December 7, is your annual opportunity to review your current coverage and make updates for the year ahead.

### During this time, you can:

- \* Join, switch, or drop a Medicare Advantage plan
- \* Enroll in or change your Medicare Part D prescription drug plan  
(Please note: Medigap policies are not included in this enrollment period)
- \* Medigap coverage can be reviewed at any of the year.

The decisions you make during Open Enrollment can significantly affect your health care costs and coverage. To help you make informed choices, here are three key steps to prepare for Medicare’s Open Enrollment.

### Step 1: Review Your Annual Notice of Change

Medicare plans can change from year to year, so it’s essential to make sure your current plan still meets your needs. Before Open Enrollment begins, you should receive your plan’s Annual Notice of Change typically in September. This document outlines any updates to your plan’s costs, coverage, and provider network for the upcoming year. Take time to review it carefully. Even small changes could affect your out-of-pocket expenses or access to care.

### Step 2: Assess Your Coverage Needs.

After reviewing your Annual Notice of Change, take time to evaluate whether your current Medicare plan still aligns with your health care needs. Ask yourself:

- **Have your health needs changed?** Did you start seeing new specialists or require different services this year? Make sure your current plan still covers the care you need.
- **Are your preferred providers and services included?** If you're considering a Medicare Advantage plan, check whether your doctors, specialists, and treatments are in-network.
- **Are your prescriptions covered?** Confirm that the plan includes all the medications you expect to need in 2025. Look out for restrictions such as quantity limits or prior

authorization requirements.

- **What are your out-of-pocket costs?** Understand what you’ll pay for doctor visits, hospital stays, and prescriptions. Keep in mind that most plans have an annual out-of-pocket maximum, but this usually doesn’t include drug costs.

Carefully comparing your options now can help you avoid unexpected expenses and ensure you get the care you need in the year ahead.

### Step 3: Get Trusted Advice

Choosing the right Medicare plan can feel overwhelming, especially with so many options and details to consider.

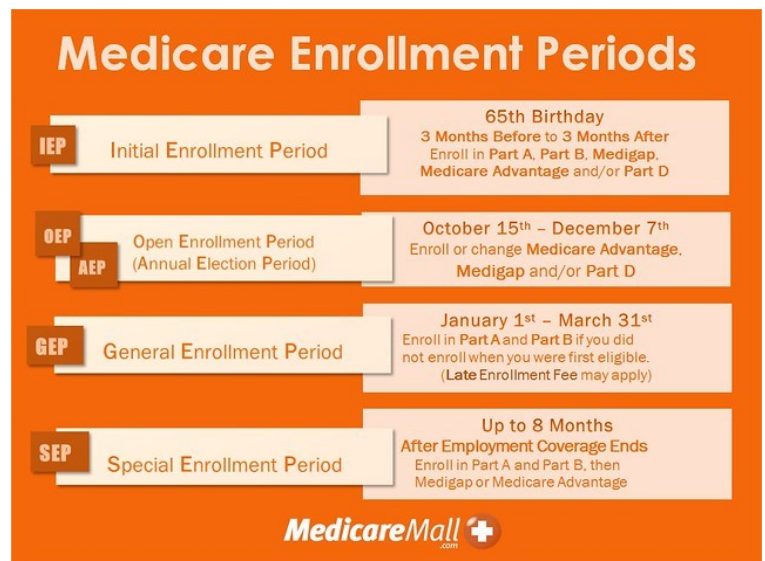

Use the Medicare Plan Finder to compare plans based on your prescriptions, providers, and preferences. You can also call (1-877-486-2048) to speak with a representative. Support is available 24/7, except on some federal holidays.

Start exploring your options early so you have time to make confident, informed decisions. With the right support, you don’t have to navigate Medicare Open Enrollment alone.

## Air Fryer Pepperoni Pizzas

**Step 1-** In small bowl, toss onion with 2 tablespoons oil and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Add pepperoni and pepperoncini and toss to combine.

**Step 2-** On lightly floured surface, shape each piece of dough to size of insert in bottom of air fryer basket.

**Step 3-** Remove air fryer insert and brush with oil. Place 1 piece of pizza dough on top and return insert to basket. Return basket to air fryer and heat air fryer to 400°F (pizza dough will begin to cook as it heats). Once air fryer reaches 400°F, air-fry 3 minutes Using tongs, flip and air-fry 2 minutes more.

**Step 4-** Top pizza with 4 slices provolone and half of pepperoni mixture. Air-fry until crust is golden brown and crisp, 7 to 8 minutes more.

**Step 5-** Transfer to cutting board and drizzle with honey. Repeat with remaining dough, cheese, and toppings. <https://www.goodhousekeeping.com/food-recipes>

## Summertime Blues

Summer is all about fun in the sun, travel and adventure; let's talk a little bit about fraudsters and two ways they try to take advantage of us.

For those who have grandkids who head south for spring break, we worry about them causing trouble and going to jail, or getting in an accident. These things can happen, but sometimes a fraudster just wants us to think they did. Fraudsters prey on unsuspecting grandparents by calling and posing as the grandchild, crying and hysterical, and asking Grandma to wire money quickly so they can get out of jail or pay for emergency medical care. Artificial intelligence technology means they can take a snippet of a voice from an online video your grandchild posted and create dialogue to truly fool anyone. (Tip: Verify identity with a family password just for emergencies and don't answer unknown callers, if it's important, they'll leave a voicemail.)

It's not just teens who travel, and fraudsters have now developed a scam for toll roads. The scam begins with a text that states you didn't pay a toll, and a warrant for your arrest will be issued if not paid immediately by clicking on the included link. And you don't have to travel to get these text messages. Texts are sent out randomly, and it's an unfortunate coincidence that you just got back from a trip. (Tip: If you missed a toll, they would send a bill via US Mail, *never* through a text message.)

Keep yourself (and your money and personal information) safe. Make certain you know who you're speaking with and never click links from people you don't know. Happy travels!

One option for the blind or visually impaired is a partnership with a trained guide dog. For many, this option helps to maintain their independence in traveling or safe mobility in their home. For those who especially enjoy sharing their life with a canine friend, it can be particularly rewarding.

Guide dog is the generic term for a dog trained to help a person with blindness or vision impairment, and other disabilities. Leader Dog, Seeing eye Dog, Guiding Eyes For the Blind are names of just 3 of the 14 schools in the USA that train guide dogs and those who use them.

On average, the dogs spend the first 12-14 months with puppy raisers, then the next 4-6 months with the trainer at the guide dog school. The dogs are then placed with the student on the first or second day of the 3 weeks the students spend at the school. The student learns to work with the training of the dogs, then the team goes home to begin their lives together.

Most of the schools provide the dog, room and board at the school, as well as transportation to and from the school with the dog, all free of charge to the student. Some schools provide continuing support, some monetary, some access to trainers, for the team's duration. Most dogs working life is 8 years, after which they may go back to the school for placement as a pet, or kept as a pet by their person.



Most schools use Golden Retrievers or Labrador Retrievers, mixes of them, some use standard Poodles or mixes of the three. Some still use German Shepards, but most are moving away from them.

A guide dog can also be raised and trained by the blind or visually impaired person. This situation can increase the bond between the dog and person, as well as allow for training to fill more specific needs.

A guide dog is a service dog. American Disabilities Act defines a Service Dog as "a dog trained to perform a task for the benefit of a person with a disability". Service Dogs enjoy the privilege of unrestricted admittance to where ever people go. Therapy or Companion dogs are excluded from this category.

The ADA nor any government authority registers or certifies service dogs.

Certification can be obtained from other sources.

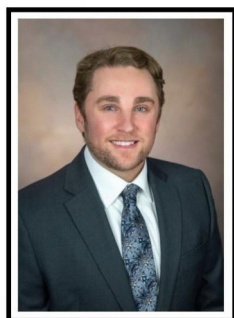



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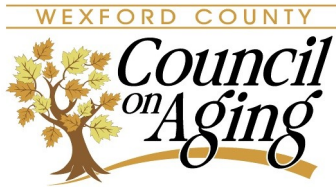
