Community Advocate

Our Community Advocate provides free one-on-one support to help seniors access resources, solve problems, and navigate services.

Most common need: help applying for food benefits and state emergency relief (MDHHS)

Snowplowing, In-Home Services, and DayBreak are provided on a sliding-fee scale, with remaining costs supported by millage or, when eligible, state or AAA funding. Our newsletter, Medicare assistance, and advocacy services are fully supported by millage. All programs are also supported by community donations.

Millage funding helps strengthen the MOWs program, which delivers essential meals and support to Wexford County seniors.

Millage funds help support the Senior Companion Program, providing reimbursement for low-income senior volunteers who offer companionship and support to local seniors. Catholic Human Services covers all program administration.

In 2025, volunteers provided 982 hours of companionship.



Manton & Cadillac Senior Center

Through the millage, we help fund programs at the local Senior Centers. While our contributions do not cover all operating costs, they play a meaningful role in strengthening services for local seniors.



We partner with WexExpress to help support the New Freedom program, which provides volunteer-based rides for seniors traveling outside the county for medical appointments. Millage funding helps cover a portion of volunteer mileage reimbursement, with WexExpress coordinating the service

Other Community Collaboration

- Senior Project Fresh – Community partner
- Low Vision Support Group – Provide Calendars (held at our office)
- VAN (Vulnerable Adult Network) – Active member
- Digital Companion Program with CTC – Students and seniors learning technology together
- In 2025, a Cadillac Community Foundation grant provided local produce to 300 older adults
- Worked with Adult Protective Services to hold an Elder Abuse Awareness event, and partnered with them throughout the year for ongoing support and resources.
- Golden Giving Tree – 14 seniors received gifts purchased by community members
- Worked with Project Christmas to purchase food and gifts for 25 home-bound seniors
- Strong ongoing partnership with the Area Agency on Aging, collaborating on programs, resources, and support for local seniors
